





Number of Partners by Years Funded - 2017




Grants by Primary Focus Area-2017

Description of Project/Partner Goals

Train community leaders and develop networks to address domestic violence. Train university students to become agents of change for peace building and protection of women's rights. Train women in active non-violence strategies in their own organizing and mobilizing work.

Work in 3 provinces to empower village representatives by training them to indentify needs, prioritize them, develop solutions/projects to address needs, and secure funding.

Support family planning and birth spacing in 3 villages. Conduct hebicide awareness and bamboo planting training in 5 communities. Provide carpenter traingin to rebuild after flooding in 6 communities.

Gender awareness training to empower women and men. Training to make organic fertilizer. Training to make soap and shampoo.

Conduct empowerment training for women to increase their leadership and decision making role in five communities. Includes ongoing follow up.

Builds the capacity of youths, farmers, women and ethnic minorities to be active in their participation, advocacy and decision making in environmental protection, land laws, mapping, human rights and gender issues. Awareness training, documentation of abuses, and advocacy with government officials is use to bring about change.

Description of Project/Partner Goals

Bi-lingual education center in Rabinal, Baja Verapaz department, offering secondary education to rural youth with degree in Rural Well-Being & Community Development. Promotes agro-ecological production to improve productivity and contribute to food sovereignty.

Coordinate with municipal and agrarian authorities to promote the care and defense of water. Form a team of community organizers who support and promote the "Prior Consultation" law. Prepare 2017 proposal for indigenous use and administration of ancestral water rights as agreed in 2013 court ruling. Develop legal startegies to advocate for indigenous populations and to modify the Ban Decree of 1967.

WJI has four main programs: Women's RIghts Education Program; Community Advocates program, Legal Services, and Adolescent Girls Program (new in 2015). In addition, WJI seeks to: Increase support services for women violence survivors through expanded referral networks and a local therapist; participate in the larger women's rights movement in Guatemala; collaborate with key Government institutions, create community based protection mechanisms for women and girls, work closely with community leaders to develop community action plans, create a strategic plan to replicate WJI work in other Guatemalan communities.

Provide Comprehensive services for victims of sexual violence including political activism, training and empowerment of women and men of the community. This year: 11 work shops on human right for women survivors of violence, 22 workshops for adolescent survicors of sexual violence, improving their resilience capacity, and complete construction of CAIMU temporary shelter, addition of 5 staff.

Educate remote communities through workshops and educational fairs on gender equity in education; legal rights; sexual & reproductive health & rights. and violence prevention. Create inter-cultural vision to develop a more just and equal society in region. Help create respect for women so girls can reach ther maximum capacity. Prevent young graduate women from returning to lives of early marriage, pregnancy, and school drop out rates.

Academic & alternative secondary school program (age 12-17) promoting gender equity among poor Chimatenango youth. Monthly workshops for students, parents and community leaders with specialized teachers on crime/violence prevention, handling conflict, and gang avoidance. School dropout prevention by providing school closer due to unaffordable cost of transportation and attendance at public school. Empowerment of youth, now conscious of social rights & obligations to prevent violence.

Description of Project/Partner Goals

BIOGI addresses agricultural degradation in western Kenya through the comprehensive instruction in/use of permaculture principles (including compatible plantings, natural fertilization, complete recycling, beekeeping) re-forestation, production/sale of bio-efficient stoves.

CIFORD provides comprehensive services in NE Kenya to improve the lives of families: sustainable agriculture, program to end female genital mutilation, re-forestation; bio efficient stove; human rights instruction; support for families with AIDS orphans with food an animals, water conservation.

Address cultural and logistical impediments to girls' education to increase their probability of staying ins school. Encourage boys to understand, respect and support the rights of girls and women. Educate girls, boys, teachers, parents and community members about dangers of female genital mutilation, early marriage and pregnancies, and gender-based violence.

In the 3rd year of funding, SaCoDe will expand its production of washable/reusable sanitary pads, inaugurate the making of panties and provide feminine hygiene information. Women will continue to be paid for their sewing.

TADEC provides education and advocacy to reduce social injustices and poverty among deaf families. Activities include: supporting education of deaf children, teaching reproductive health and HIV/AIDS awareness, providing psycho-social support to deaf families, giving young deaf women vocational training and small grants to start businesses, and advocating for rights of deaf children.

A gathering of leaders from Pangea's current and former grant partners. This two day event provides the opportunity for sharing ideas, problem solving and support. Participants network and learn from each other in order to improve their effectiveness as leaders in their communities.



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
